In accordance with Chapter 551, Texas Government Code, and Section 49.063, Texas Water Code, both as amended, take notice that the Board of Directors of Harris County Municipal Utility District No. 396 will meet in regular session, open to the public, at the offices of Norton Rose Fulbright US LLP, 1301 McKinney Street, Houston, Texas, at 12:00 p.m. on Wednesday, January 9, 2019. 7. Engineer's Report, authorization of any necessary engineering work or stormwater pollution prevention services;
8. Report on Joint Operations Council;
9. Sidewalk Project and any necessary action;
10. Report on Eminent Domain Filing;
11. Other Consultant and Director Reports;
12. Next meeting date (February 13, 2019).

and such other matters as may properly come before it.

NOTICE REGARDING MEETING PLACE

After at least 25 qualified electors are residing in the District, on a written request of at least five of those electors, the Board of Directors shall designate a meeting place and hold meetings within the District if it determines that the meeting place used by the District deprives residents of a reasonable opportunity to attend District meetings. On the failure to designate the location of the meeting place within the District, five electors may petition the Texas Commission on Environmental Quality to designate a location. If the Commission determines that the meeting place used by the District deprives the residents of a reasonable opportunity to attend District meetings, the Commission may designate a meeting place inside or outside the District which is reasonably available to the public and require that the meetings be held at such place.
